## Sacramental Information

**Baptisms:** Congratulations on expecting your child! Before your child's Baptism, parents are expected to attend a Pre-Baptismal instruction class held on the third Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the Msgr. McMahon Church Library. Attendance at such a program is necessary before any infant's Baptism is scheduled. Baptisms are *usually* celebrated at 1:15 p.m. on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month, and must be scheduled in advance.

**Marriages:** Congratulations on your engagement! As a couple seeking a Catholic marriage, you should meet with the priest at least six months in advance of the marriage to make arrangements and set the date. Attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) is required. Pre-Cana Coordinators are David & Donna Ortolani, please call them at 633-9908.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA):** Is the Holy Spirit prompting you to become Catholic? Those who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith should contact the Rectory.

**Care of the Sick:** Call anytime to arrange for a visit. If you desire to see a priest, please call as soon as possible. Arrangements can be for the sick to receive Holy Communion at home. Please notify the Rectory of sick parishioners who are in the hospital.

**Anointing of the Sick:** If you or a family member are nearing the end of your life's journey, anticipating surgery or a stay in the hospital and wish to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please call the Rectory.

**Moving:** We are sad to see you go. Please notify the rectory office when moving out of the Parish so our parish register is up-to-date.

## Mass Confusion?


At the end of November, the Catholic Church of the United States will be implementing some changes to the language used at Mass. This is not something that we as parishioners need to be nervous or frustrated about, but it is something that is meant to lead us to a deeper understanding of our liturgy.

During the next few weeks information and examples of the new dialogue text at mass will be placed in the bulletin to give us some background to these changes before they start.

### Week #2

#### Why do we need a *new* translation?



In 1973, the first English missal was published. Prior to 1973 the language of the Mass was Latin. In the first translation from Latin to English a method of translating known as dynamic equivalence was used. This method of translation was meant to communicate a general meaning of the Latin text, not a literal or a word-for-word translation. This loose translation resulted in some of the rich spiritual metaphors and images being lost. Some important theological concepts were also unclear and several biblical allusions were not as noticeable as they should have been.

Because of these factors, in 2001 the Vatican called for a more precise translation that gives Catholics a better sense of the richness of the Latin text. Using this approach, the new translation of the Mass preserves the theological traditions captured throughout the centuries in the liturgy as well as communicating the many biblical and theological concepts of the Latin more clearly.
